Annual Meeting set for Nov. 30

Program to focus on new book about Union Avenue UMC

After two years of compiling the history of the Union Avenue United Methodist Church, Karen Perone and the History Committee of the church are ready to unveil their book, titled "This is Our Story: A History of Union Avenue Church."

A book launch for the congregation will be held in conjunction with the Alliance Historical Society's annual meeting on Wednesday, November 30 at 6:30 p.m. in the church's sanctuary.

Karen Perone, the church historian and president of the Alliance Historical Society, will offer a presentation and slide show on the history of the church. Copies of the book will also be available for purchase and pre-ordered books can be picked up at that time.



Open Hours At Mabel's



Mabel's serves as set for student production

If you're looking for a Victorian backdrop in Alliance, you can't get much better than the Mabel Hartzell Historical Home.

Some University of Mount Union students found that out when they used the historic Carnation City landmark owned by the Alliance Historical Society as a set to film some scenes for a 15-minute film on Thursday, April 14.

It is believed to be the first time that the Mabel Hartzell Historical Home – located at 840 N. Park Ave. and built in 1867 by Matthew Earley – was used as a theatrical set.

"The house is gorgeous," said Rachel Vaughan. "This is absolutely what we were looking for."

Vaughan was leading a group of four other Raider Student Media crew members in producing footage for "The Romantics," a short screenplay she wrote that starred herself as well as Brady Pierce.

Vaughan, a resident of Minerva, said the piece is not set in any particular year.

"It's not really a depiction of history," said Vaughan. "It's a depiction of a romance writer's idea of history."

Pierce, general manager of Raider Student Media during the 2021-2022 academic year, noted that "The Romantics" was the latest in a number of projects the club had produced for Studio M, the group's YouTube channel, including "Freeman Hall," a seven-minute film in which a group of students discover a DVD from 1992 that contains something sinister; a sing-along video for Christmas, and a short piece titled "A Single's Guide to Valentine's Day."

Overall, Raider Student Media, a student-led extra-curricular organization, also encompasses WRMU (91.1 FM) and The Dynamo, the university's radio station and newspaper, respectively. In all, approximately 30 students are active in Raider Student Media, according to

Pierce, including three others who were part of the behind-the-scenes crew at Mabel's – Mint Baston, who is from the Columbus area; K Carson, who is from the Austintown area; and Hunter Miday, of Louisville.

None of the students had visited the Mabel Hartzell Historical Home previously.

"We were desperately searching for somewhere to film the older scenes," explained Vaughan. "I googled historical homes, and I was so surprised that I found this so close. We reached out and got permission to use the home, and I am so excited that we did. It was absolutely perfect for what we needed."
